- 2. In listing the proposed new foreign investment projects, they are to be grouped by geographic area and by type of business. The latter grouping (type of business) shall distinguish between major activities, such as distributing organizations, manufacturing, mining, financing, etc.
- D. PART B.-SHIPMENTS, EMPLOYMENT AND WELFARE EXPENDITURES OF ALLIED FOREIGN ORGANIZATIONS
- 1. Item 3.-Value of shipments (in United States dollars) grouped by country and by type of business of the foreign organization.
- a. Round value of shipments to the nearest \$1,000.
- b. Estimated approximate percent of total capacity represented by total sales should be shown to the nearest 5 percent. Capacity should be based on what the reporting organization ordinarily regards as the maximum production that could have been attained in 1950 with the existing facilities.
- 2. Item 4. -Foreign employment grouped by country and by type of business.
- a. Enter the figures available at the reporter's home office. If accurate book figures are not available, enter the best estimate available at the reporter's office. If estimates are entered, so indicate on the form.
- 3. Item 5a. -Describe briefly the training or instruction, other than "on the job" instruction, which foreign workers obtain through the foreign organization.

Include under this item training schools or classes operated by the foreign company for the benefit of the employees, or any plan which is designed to fit employees for executive or technical jobs at the expense of the foreign organization.

4. Item 5b. -Include in this table any welfare activities which have cost the foreign organization \$50,000 or more in 1950.
