Gentlemen:

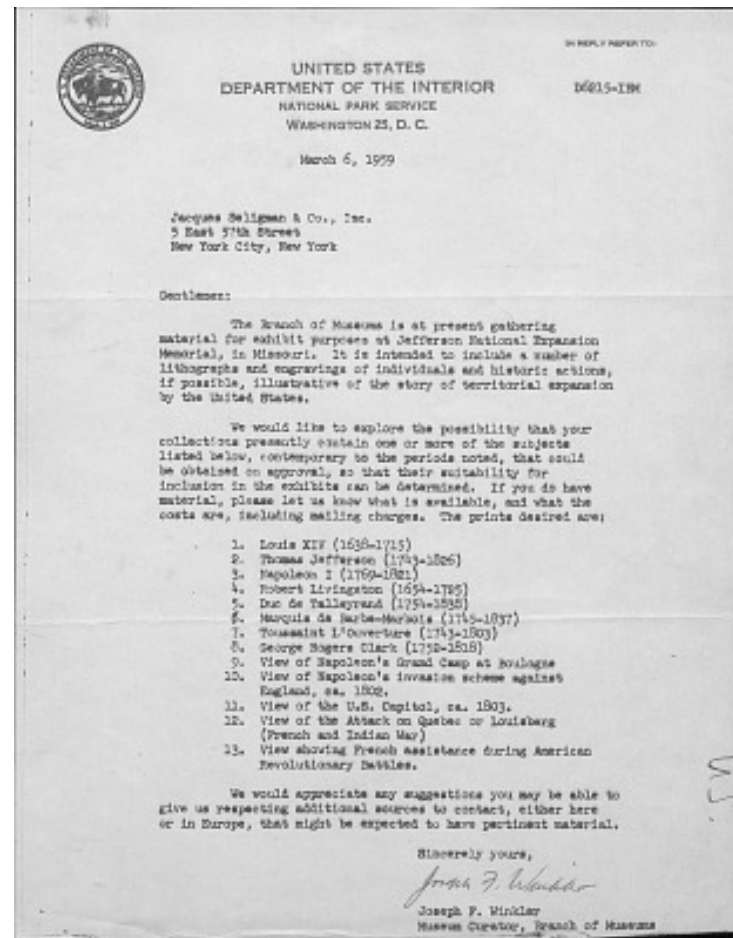
