Gentlemen:-

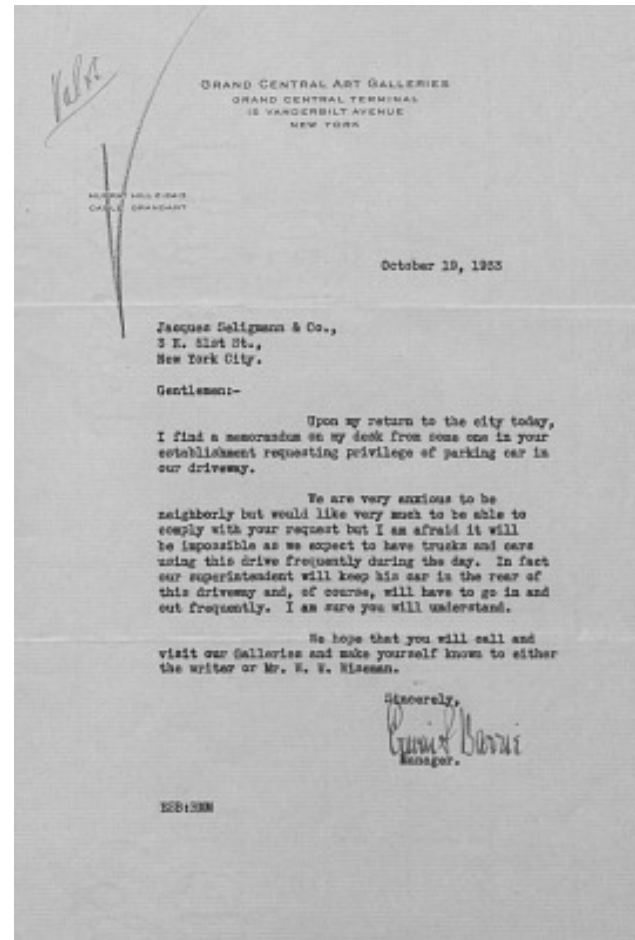
Upon my return to the city today, I find a memorandum on my desk from some one in your establishment requesting privilege of parking car in our driveway.
