Fish Commission.- [[/underlined]] 108 specimens, 10 species of water birds from the coasts of Massachusetts and from the Newfoundland banks, collected by the naturalists at Woods Hole, and on board the [[underlined]] "Albatross" [[/underlined]] and the [[underlined]] Grampus [[/underlined]]. The collection is very valuable and interesting containing as it does a series of 44 specimens of [[underlined]] Puffinus borealis [[/underlined]] (which was only described a few years ago and up to date a very rare species in collections), besides very large series of [[underlined]] Jaegers, Stercorarius parasiticus [[/underlined]] and [[underlined]] promarinus [[/underlined]]) illustrating the enormous individual color-variations in these birds. Nearly one half of the collection was received in the flesh and was prepared by the taxidermist, who also mounted a great many of them an excellent style for the exhibition series. Only part of the collection were received during October, though for reasons detailed in the report for September first entered in the museum register during the former month.
