13 species, from the District of Columbia.


[[underlined]] Valdemar Knudsen, [[/underlined]] Kauai, Hawaiian Island.-

Stejneger as [[underlined]] Himantopus knudseni, Chasiempis dolei, Phaeornis myadestina, Himatione parva, [[/underlined]] and [[underlined]] Oreomyza bairdi, [[/underlined]] the latter being a type of a new genus.
