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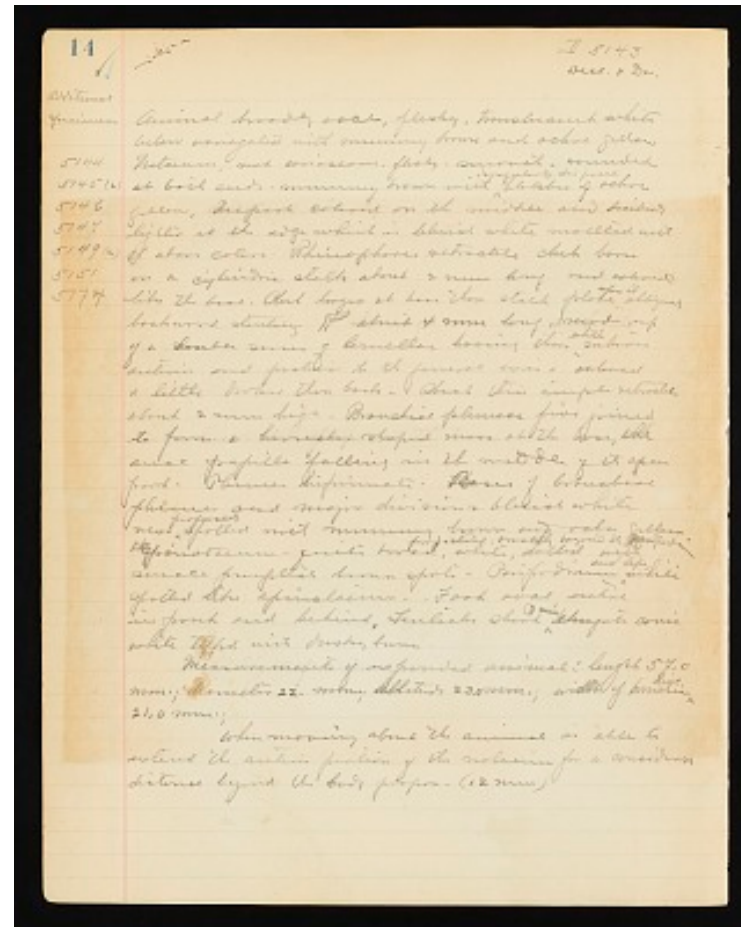
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Animal broadly oval, fleshy, translucent white below variegated with mummy brown and ochre yellow
Notaeum, not coriaceous, fleshy, smooth, rounded at both ends, mummy brown with irregularly dispersed blotches of ochre green, deepest colored on the middle and decidedly lighter at the edge which is bluish white mottled with all above colors.
Rhinophores retractile club borne on a cylindrical stalk about 2 mm long and colored like the base. Club longer at base than stalk place upon it obliquely backward slanting pencil drawing of sloped shaft with striated horn off right at an angle with the shaft about 4 mm long, made up of a double series of lamellar housing thin white tubular anterior and posterior to the general axis, colored a little darker than back. Sheath thin simple retractile about 2 mm high. Branchial plumes five joined to form a horseshoe shaped mass at the base, the anal papilla falling in the middle of its open part. Plumes tripinnate. Bases of branchial plumes and major divisions bluish white rest profusely spotted with mummy brown and ochre yellow Epinotaeum quite broad, projecting smoothly beyond its Epipodium while dotted with small purplish brown spots. Peripodium and lips white spotted like epinotaeum. Foot oval entire in front and behind. Tentacles short (3 mm) elongate conic white tipped with dusky brown.

Measurements of expanded animal: length 57.0 mm.; diameter 22. mm.; altitude 23.0 mm.; width of branchia disc 21.0 mm.;

When moving about the animal is able to extend the anterior portion of the notaeum for a considerable distance beyond the body proper. (12. mm)



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
