First let me say how much obliged I am to you for the data on the Chantilly drawings.

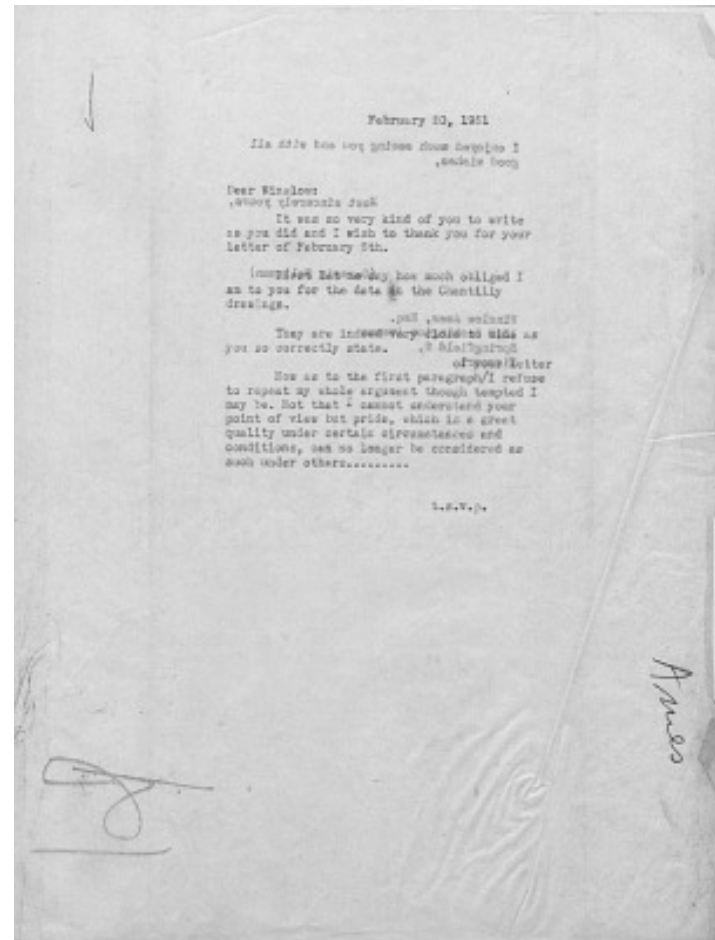
They are indeed very close to mine as you so correctly state.
