Vous le devinez, je ne suis pas autrement surpris de cette fin de non recevoir.

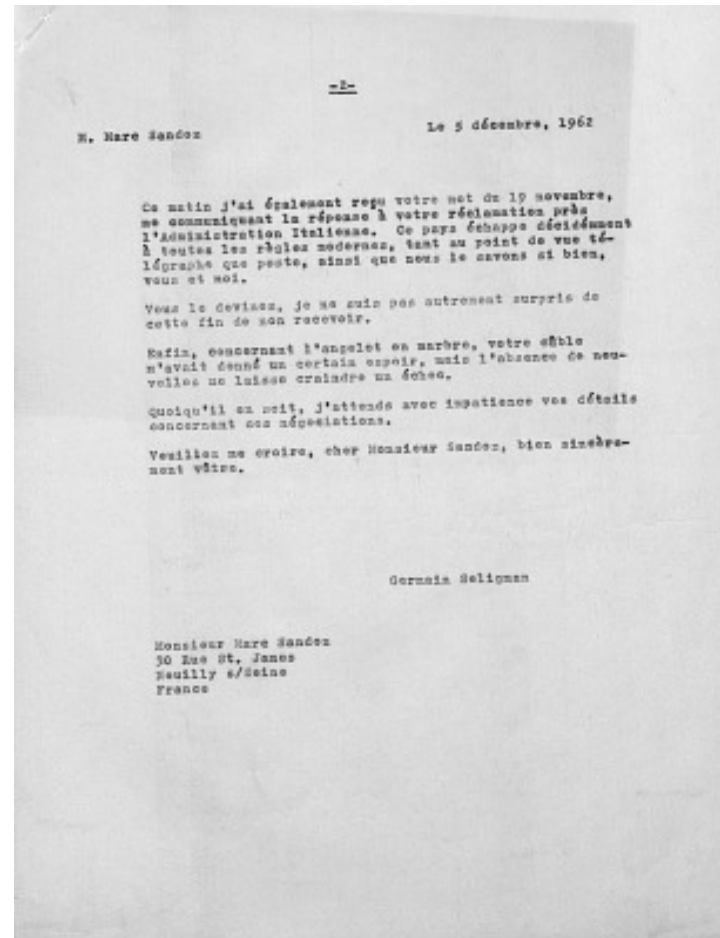
Enfin, concernant l'angelot en marbre, votre câble m'avait donné un certain espoir, mais l'absence de nouvelles me laisse craindre un échec.
