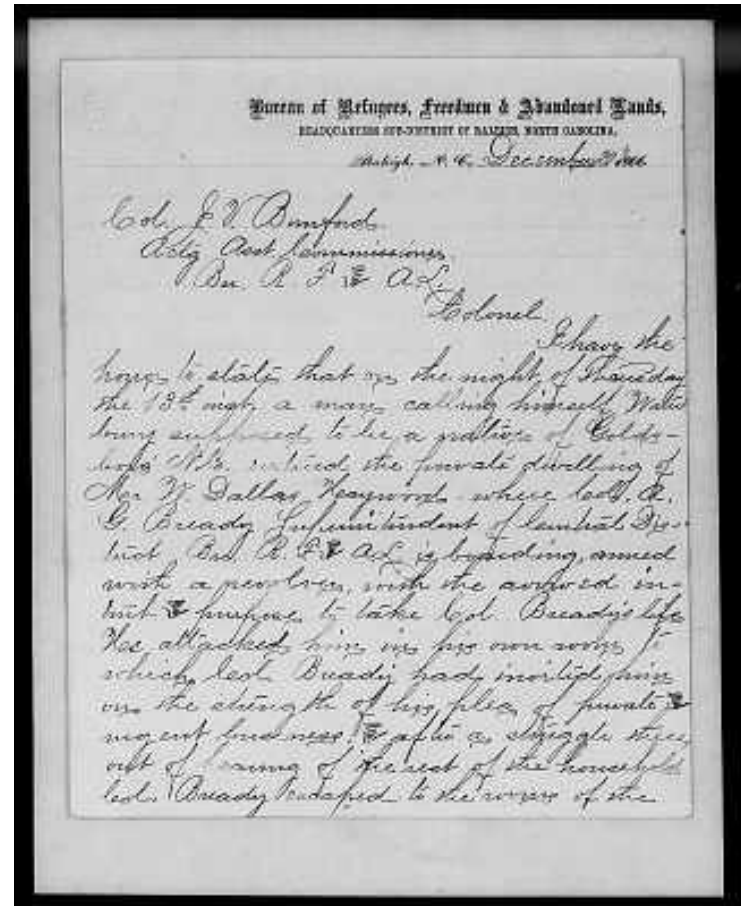

I have the honor to state that on the night of Thursday the 13th inst. a man calling himself Waterbury supposed to be a native of Goldsboro' N Ca entered the private dwelling of Mr. W. Dallas Haywood - where Col. A. G. Bready Superintendent of Central District Bu. R. F. and A. L. is boarding, armed with a revolver, with the avowed intent and purpose to take Col. Bready's life He attacked him in his own room to which Col. Bready had invited him on the strength of his plea of private and urgent business, and after a struggle there, out of hearing of the rest of the household Col. Bready escaped to the rooms of the
