

Hunter of the State of Virginia and County of Essex have this day bargained and sold unto John Rouzee of the above mentioned state and County a negroe woman called Charlotte with her child also a negroe girl called Kate for and in the consideration of one hundred and eighty five pounds lawfull money - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th of September 1805 -
