1.25 AM - Have been mixing mud since midnight.

4.00 AM - Mud ready. Preparing to go back in hole with 8 3/4 bit. Townsend sent for to run dye test.

4.45. Reamed ^[[with 8 3/4 rock bit]] to 1244' & lost 6 inches of mud with no return of circulation.

5.00 AM Practically nothing opposing bit from 1248-1260. Hit solid rock at 1260. Still no circulation About 18 inches of mud lost so far. Kelly chattering loud at 1266. String hard to raise but not frozen. From 1264 To 1272 is hard drilling.

5.13.AM. A total of 25 inches of mud lost since bit was returned to hole after coring and in drilling to 1272 - no return of circulation Ceased pumping & drilling at 1272 (5.14 AM) + sent for tool pusher. Rotating kelly without pumping bit about 25' off bottom.
