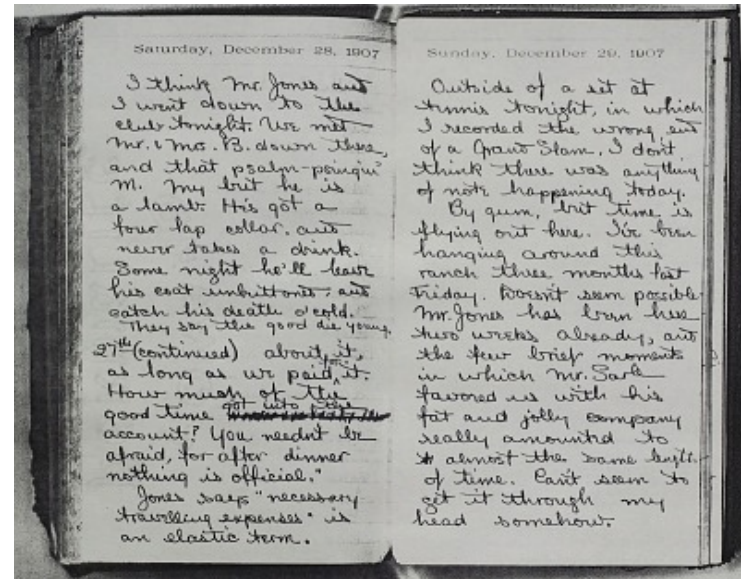
Jones says "necessary travelling expenses" is an elastic term.
