12- L 28.5 cm; 4 x 1.5 x 1.5; 5 cm; loosely spun green, 1/2 full, breaks easily  
13- L 29.5 cm; 5 x 2 x 2; 4 cm " " ; red, 1/2 full, finely spun  
14- L 30 cm; 4.5 x 2 x 2; 4 cm; coarsely spun brown alpaca -vvery strong  
15- L 30 cm; 4.5 x 1.5 x 2; 5 cm; loosely spun black fallingoff spindle

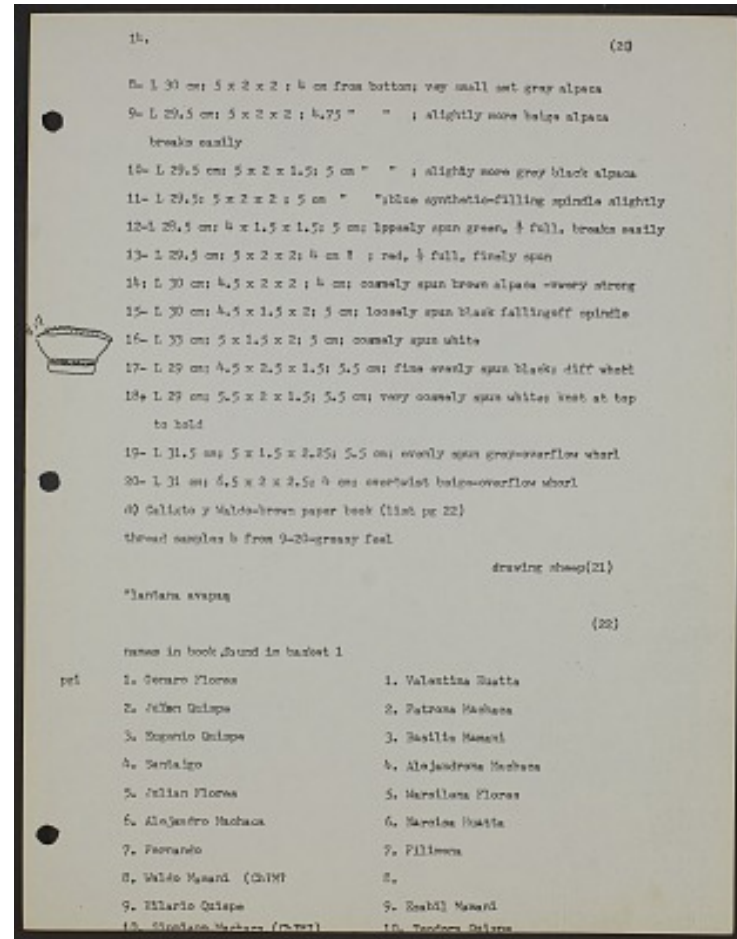
