Looking forward to seeing you in the not too distant future I hope,

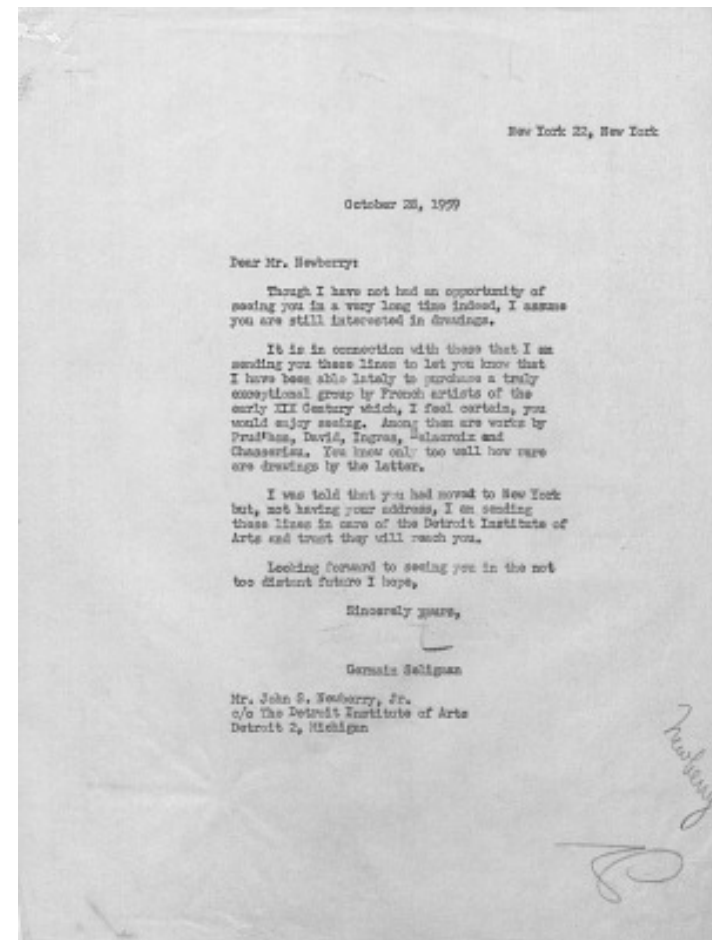
