Before this case comes on for hearing I expect to go down to Cuyahoga Falls and hve a talk with Mr. Strassman regarding your case.

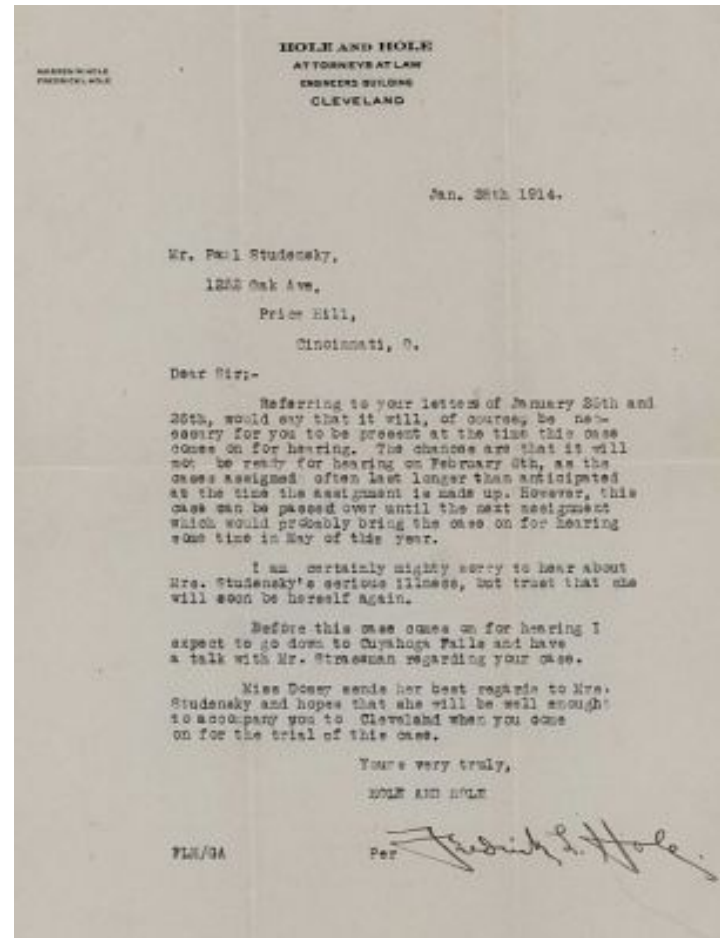
Miss Dosey sends her best regards to Mrs. Studensky and hopes that she will be well enough to accompany you to Cleveland when you come on for the trial of this case.
