Dear Mrs. Zorn:

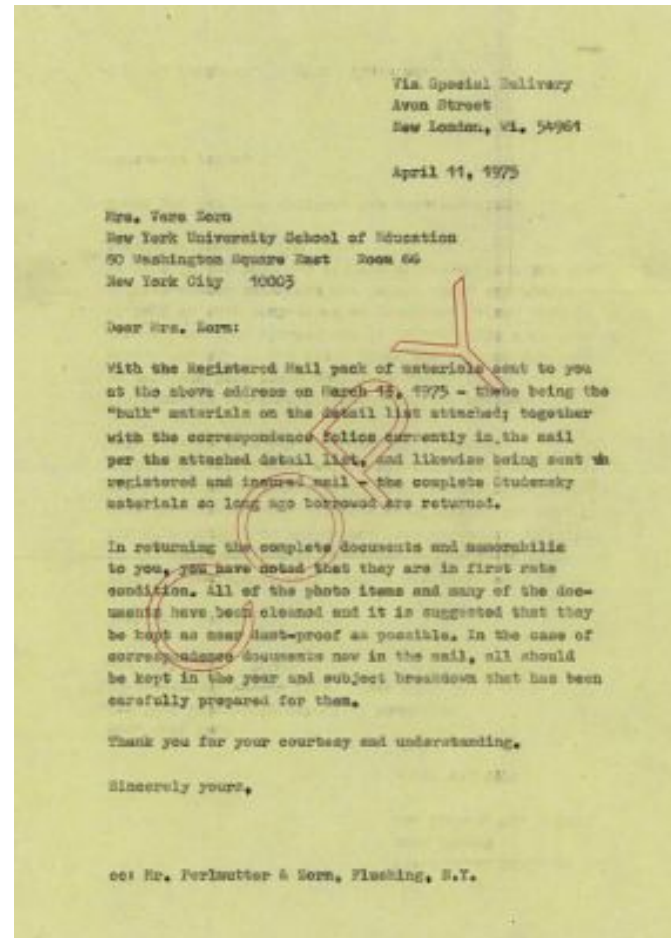
