Curators from the National Museum of American History have been working to assure the accuracy of contents. The completion of the film is scheduled for October, to coincide with the first anniversary following last year's festivities.



Also, there is considerable interest for a telecast on the Public Broadcasting Network via WGBH-TV, Boston.

Euell, the Assistant Secretary for Public Service since 1973, will be leaving the Smithsonian to become the Director of the Oakland Museum in California on October 1.
