

Sir:-

I have the honor to report the following case for approval.

On May 14, 186[[0?]], William Barnaby, a half-breed Omaha, married Julia Barada, the daughter of Antoine Barada, a half-breed Omaha, residing on the Nemaha Reservation. After William Barnaby's marriage he brought his wife to this Reservation to live with his mother a full-blood Omaha, who named Mary Barnaby, who afterward married a Ponca Indian named [[?Paqinaker]], and died on
