That after the survey and appraisement of said 2 lands the Secretary of the Interior shall be, and he hereby is, 3 authorized to issue proclamation to the effect that unalloitted 4 lands at the date of the passage of this act are open for set-5 tlement, under such rules and regulations as he may prescribe. 6 That at any time within not less than six months nor more 7 than one year after the date of settlement under such 8 proclamation each bona fide settler occupying any portion of 9 said land, and having made valuable improvements thereon 10 or the heirs-at-laws of such settler, who is a citizen of the United 11 States, or who has declared his intention to become such, 12 shall be entitled to purchase, for cash, through the United 13 States land-office of the district in which said land is situated, 14 the lands so occupied and improved by him, not to exceed one 15 hundred and sixty acres in such case, according to the survey 16 and appraised value of said land as provided in section one of 17 this act: [[italics]] Provided, [[/italics]] That the Secretary of the Interior 18 may dispose of the same upon the following terms as to pay-19 ments, that is to say: One-third of the price of said land to 20 become due and payable [[strikethrough]] one [[/strikethrough]] ^[[two]] years from the date of entry, 21 one-third in [[strikethrough]] two [[/strikethrough]] ^[[3]] years, and
