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Please bear this matter of credit line in mind whenever publishing any of these photographs. Also we would like to know what is going to be used in advance by "letter and number."


Also I would liked to have seen what you sent Bruce and would appreciate a set of prints of those photos. This would save me the trouble of asking for copies.
