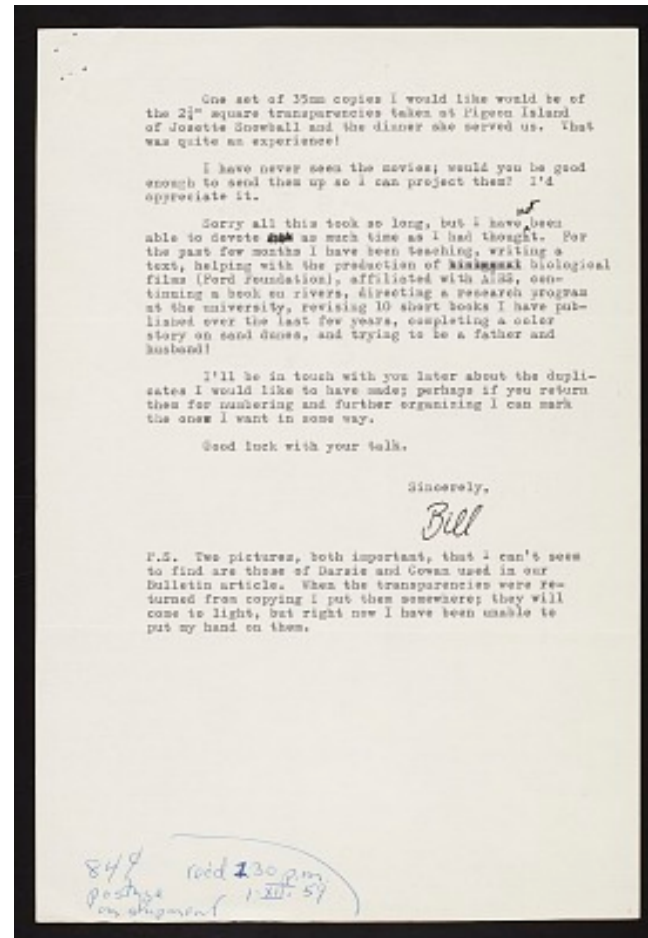
I'll be in touch with you later about the duplicates I would like to have made; perhaps if you return them for numbering and further organization I can mark the ones I want in some way.
