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and the cantonment of Camp Bowie, and to skirt the smoke-palled city. At Benbrook I found a camp inferior to ours at Hicks; at Everman I stopped for dinner and had a pleasant reunion with many of the original 79 from Toronto. Everman is a good field, too. And to see a soldier camp such as Bowie was good practice for what we'll probably search out behind the Hun lines. The tents, barracks, parades of men and horses were distinguishable to a marked degree. The camera would show the details the eye missed and I appreciated the fact that reconnaissance from the air is The Thing in this war.

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
