

General,

Since the operations under Gen Twiggs in Fla. in 1849-50 I have found it for the public interest to make verbal agreements only for the supply of pork beef to the troops on this frontier & I continued that [[?]] until I ceased to do duty in the Dept.

The unsettled state of the Indians, and the great changes in the [[?]] of the garrison presented the offer of [[underlined]] real [[/underlined]] sureties or bonds. I therefore made verbal (but public) agreements with the lowest responsible bidder, with the understanding that I should not call for fresh beef at Ft. Meyers whenever I deemed it dangerous for the contractor to arrive stock there; - also that where the issues of Beef [[?]] is small or to take but half an animal or up the price should be raised
