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3) Indianer im Kriegsschmuck: Wenn der Indianer in den Krieg zieht, trägt er entweder einen Anzug von Büffelleder oder er bekleidet sich nur mit wollenen Decken. Auf dem Kopf befestigt er sich eine Rosette von bunten Federn, die in einem Schweif zum Rücken hinabhängt. Oft bemalt er sich auch mit grellen Farben, um für den Feind einen möglichst schauererregenden Anblick zu bieten. Seine Waffen bestehen aus Büchse, Messer und kurzstielliger Axt (Tomahawk). In früheren Zeiten trugen die Indianer Bogen und Pfeil, Schleuder, Keule und Speer. In zahlreiche Stämme geteilt, leben sie über ganz Nord- und Mittelamerika verbreitet.

Dieser Pfeil auf der Schachtel zeigt wie man die neue S-arott-i-Packung (sprich Si) der bekannten Schokoladenfabrik "Sarotti" bequem und praktisch öffnen kann. Die Eigenart der S-i-Packung schützt den Inhalt gegen schädliche Einflüsse von außen, sodaß die Pralinés ihre Reinheit, Frische und guten Geschmack lange Zeit bewahren.



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
