A Cultural, educational association founded to maintain services and programs which bring the visual arts to the people in every state in the Union. Its aim is to give the public important information about the arts in America. Through its various activities it promotes community participation in the arts, offers encouragement to artists and records art history in the making.

Financing of the regular program is almost wholly carried by members' dues, publication sales and subscriptions, and fees for service. Therefore, individual and corporate gifts can be used to establish new programs and to provide capital funds for the improvement of all activities

A Primary function of the AFA is to work constantly to make art a part of the daily lives of the people. The AFA is a democratic organization, governed by a Board of Trustees, elected annually by the membership. Its director and paid professional staff carry out the program in collaboration with the committees of leading art authorities and representatives of its member museums and all art institutions and groups.

circulating annually 60 exhibitions of original works of art in America. It has assembled and sent on national and foreign tour nearly 2,000 special exhibitions having 10,000 individual showings in museums, colleges, schools, libraries and art clubs.

providing a national art information center that handles hundreds of inquiries monthly from students, professionals and the public concerning art facilities and activities. As a national association, it cooperates with state and federal agencies and serves as a sponsor for special programs on behalf of its member museums and art groups.

servicing the needs of the nearly 500 art organizations in America, which comprise its affiliated membership, and acting as their clearing house in Washington.

providing a platform for the interchange of ideas and review of events in art at the AFA Convention. Each year in May, a major museum is host for this important meeting of the art world.
