Note: Operations for the First 4 months of 1958 show a strong increase in income from exhibition fees, and a leveling off of income from membership. Expenses for the same period are somewhat higher than for the corresponding period of 1957. The operating deficit on May 1st was \$1,642. This deficit will climb rapidly during the summer months when exhibition bookings drop off severely. From current rends, it appears that the actual deficit will not exceed the budgeted amount of \$25,000, and will probably be somewhat less.
