LINCOLN CENTER THEATER (Producer), now in its 15th year, has become one of New York's favorite not-for-profit theaters, with productions at Lincoln Center's Vivian Beaumont and Mitzi E. Newhouse Theaters, and other theaters on and off of Broadway, as well as touring productions nationally and around the world, TV and film projects and original cast recordings. Marie Christine is LCT's 77th production. LCT's production history includes a number of memorable American and world premieres, including Contact by Susan Stroman and John Weidman, Parade by Alfred Uhry, Jason Robert Brown and Harold Prince, Far East by A.R. Gurney, A New Brain by William Finn and James Lapine, Racing Demon and Via Dolorosa by David Hare, Arcadia by Tom Stoppard, The Sisters Rosensweig by Wendy Wasserstein, Six Degrees of Separation by John Guare, Speed-the-Plow by David Mamet, Sarafina! by Mbongeni Ngema, Two Shakespearean Actors by Richard Nelson and subUrbia by Eric Bogosian. LCT's noteworthy revivals include The House of Blue Leaves by John Guare, Anything Goes by Cole Porter, The Front Page by Ben Hecht and Charles MacArthur, Waiting for Godot by Samuel Beckett, Our Town by Thornton Wilder, Abe Lincoln in Illinois by Robert E. Sherwood, Rodgers & Hammerstein's Carousel, The Heiress by Ruth and Augustus Goets, Edward Albee's A Delicate Balance and Shakespeare's Twelfth Night. In addition to its full-scale productions, Lincoln Center Theater also develops new work and young artists through regular play readings, rehearsed workshops of plays and musicals in progress, and an annual Directors Lab. "Open Stages," LCT's education program, reaches over 9,000 New York City public school students in grades 7-12 with curriculum-related projects, tickets to LCT productions and a Shakespeare collaboration with The Juilliard School. Finally, LCT publishes a Journal, Lincoln Center Theater Review (formerly The New Theater Review), each issue of which explores subjects based upon
