HINTON BATTLE (John), two-time Tony Award winner, made his Broadway debut at 16 creating the role of the Scarecrow in The Wiz, received rave reviews in Bob Fosse's Dancin' and as James "Thunder" Early in Michael Bennett's Dreamgirls. He was awarded his first Tony for Sophisticated Ladies [[/italics]] and later starred in its tour of the USSR. The Tap Dance Kid earned Hinton his second Tony, a Fred Astaire Award and the NAACP Image Award. He headlined Ain't Misbehavin' in Las Vegas and Stardust at the Kennedy Center. Television credits include the NBC miniseries "13 Days to Glory," "The Tracey Ullman Show" and "The Boys Special" on ABC. Hinton hosted his own video dance show, "ID" (It's Dance); and appeared at The Presidential Inauguration; "Tap in America"; the Ace, Tony and Grammy awards; Happy Birthday Hollywood; and "Night of 100 Stars." He has performed his act to sold-out audiences in Japan. As choreographer, he has performed with Anita Baker, Sister Sledge and Klymax, and created videos for Rick Astley, Starpoint, Cherrelle, Tommy Page and The Boys. He choreographed for the group New World, which was the Adult Dance grand prize winner on the recent "Star Search" finals.

WILLY FALK (Chris) was raised in New York and Hawaii, and is a graduate of Harvard University and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. He has appeared on Broadway in Les Misérables, Starlight Express and Marilyn: An American Fable. His Off-Broadway shows include Pacific Overtures, Elizabeth & Essex and The Robber Bridegroom. He has also performed in national tours of Les Misérables and A Chorus Line. Willy writes and records his own pop/rock music and is very grateful for the loving support of family and friends.

LIZ CALLAWAY (Ellen) made her Broadway debut in Stephen Sondheim's Merrily We Roll Along. She received a Tony nomination for her portrayal of Lizzie in Maltby & Shire's Baby and later appeared here at the Broadway Theatre in The Three Musketeers. Other New York credits include Marry Me a Little; No Way to Treat a Lady; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5; Brownstone; and the workshop production of Grover's Corners, the Schmidt & Jones musical adaptation of Our Town. Regionally, she has appeared in Sunday in the Park with George, Evita and A Little Night Music. Recordings include A Stephen Sondheim Evening and the acclaimed Follies in Concert. On television she has appeared in "Senior Trip" with Mickey Rooney, "In Performance at the White House" and "Lyle, the Crocodile" for HBO. For the last three years she has cohosted "Ready to Go," a daily, live children's program for WHDH-TV (CBS) in Boston For her work on this show, she received a 1989 Emmy Award.
