For the past four years the Transcript has covered the Boston and New York Expositions in a most extensive manner. Again it will cooperate and more than do its part to make this Exposition a success.

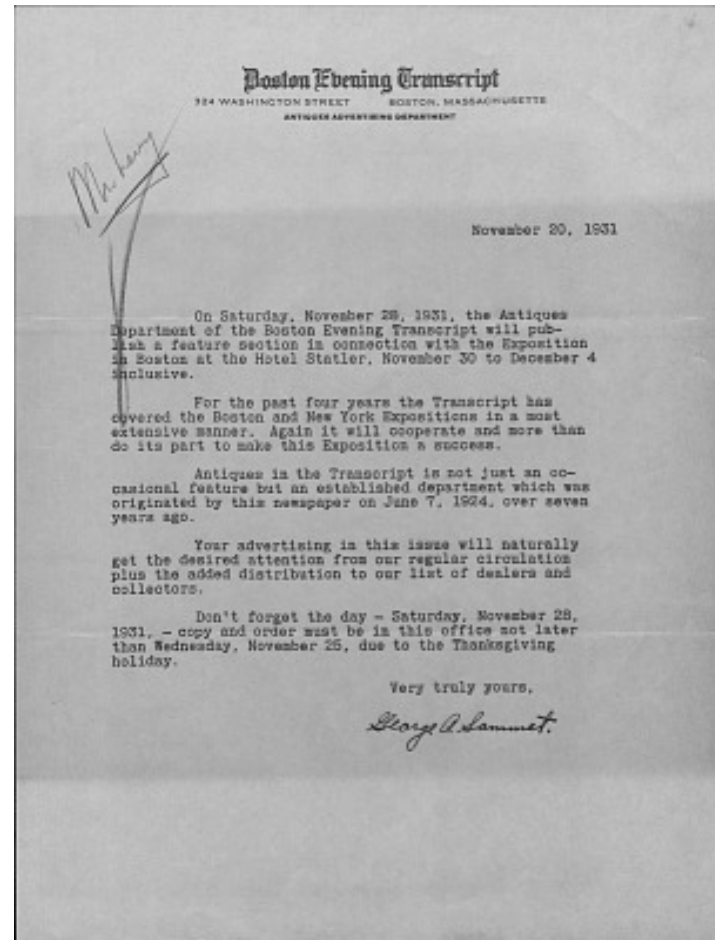
Antiques in the Transcript is not just an occasional feature but an established department which was originated by this newspaper on June 7, 1924, over seven years ago.
