"Don't give up the ship!"

Everybody's talking about GREAT AUNT FANNY'S at 340 W. 46th St. Gregarious Bill Cressler and Margie Baldwin, who have labored in the business offices of several stage and film ventures, have just opened a restaurant for actors. There are inexpensive burger and egg dishes along with more ambitious fare. The home-made pies are spectacular. Enjoy their superb collection of tapes of theatre tunes and rare early Billie Holiday recordings.

James Coco, George C. Scott, and Henry Fonda are among the members who have been dropping in at JACK DELANEY'S STEAKHOUSE at 72 Grove Street these fall nights. The reasons are a new owner, a new menu with an Italian accent, and pianist Murray Grand with a bulging portfolio of showtunes. The new owner is Paul S. Brancella, who got his training uptown at Mama Laura's. Try his sinfully succulent scampi.

The Hibernians are coming. In fact, they're in full charge of an old mansion at 22 East 54th Street, directly across the street from the salon of hair stylist Kenneth. REIDY'S is darlin' Irish pub, presided over by a lot of Reidys from County Limerick. The prices are unreasonably low. The bar is noisy and joyous. The Irish lamb and vegetable stew is fit for Gaelic kings, and the bread pudding has a downhome flavor.

Four romantics everywhere, LA CAVE HENRI IV is the place, a few steps down at 227 East 50th St. Candle-lit and casually elegant, this cozy rendezvous has inspired countless proposals, including marriage. The Gallic cookery is inventive, and the prices are surprisingly moderate. The thin crêpes plumped out with chopped seafood and memorable appetizers. And try the unusual bread pudding, prepared with black cherries and top with a delicate vanilla sauce. At the piano is Paul Mann.
