Have decided that the greatest happiness is in great economy and am going to practice it from this day.

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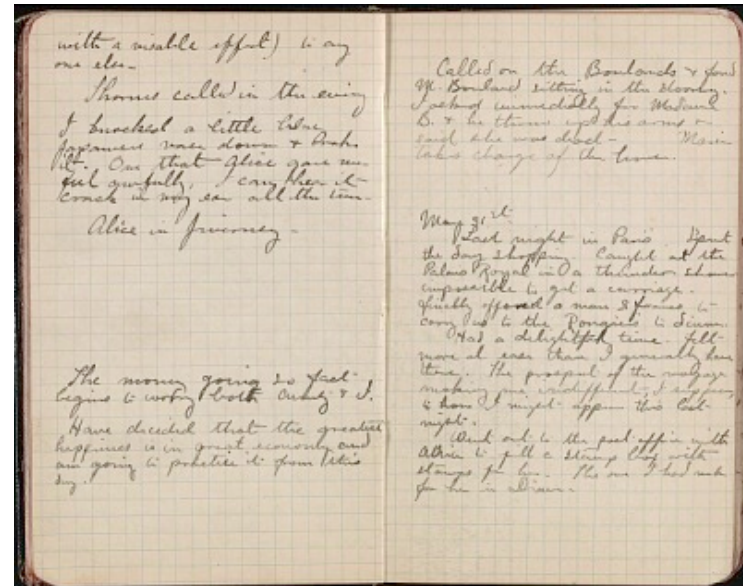
