## Echoes of the Past

25 Years Ago

(June 27-July 3, 1946)

The war department's latest casualty list on World War II showed that 308,978 men and women who served in the army were killed in the 4-year war. Included were 1,424 still listed as missing. The navy announced that 37,659 naval, marine corps and coast guard personnel lost their lives as a result of the war. Of that total, 928 were listed as missing but were presumed to be dead. U.S. deaths totaled about 126,000 in World War I. Only three of the nation's 3,000-odd countries did not suffer any World War II casualties, the army said. They were King county, Tex., Esmeralda county Nev., and Yellowstone National Park county, Wyo.

By the will of Mrs. Amanda Ramsey, \$2000 in cash was bequeathed to the Hively United Baptist Church. Income from the sum, to be invested, was to be used for church property upkeep.
