
San Francisco - "The Golden Gate City", a city of charm, color, progressive and exciting - is a fitting setting to launch the second phase of Alpha's program of community service.

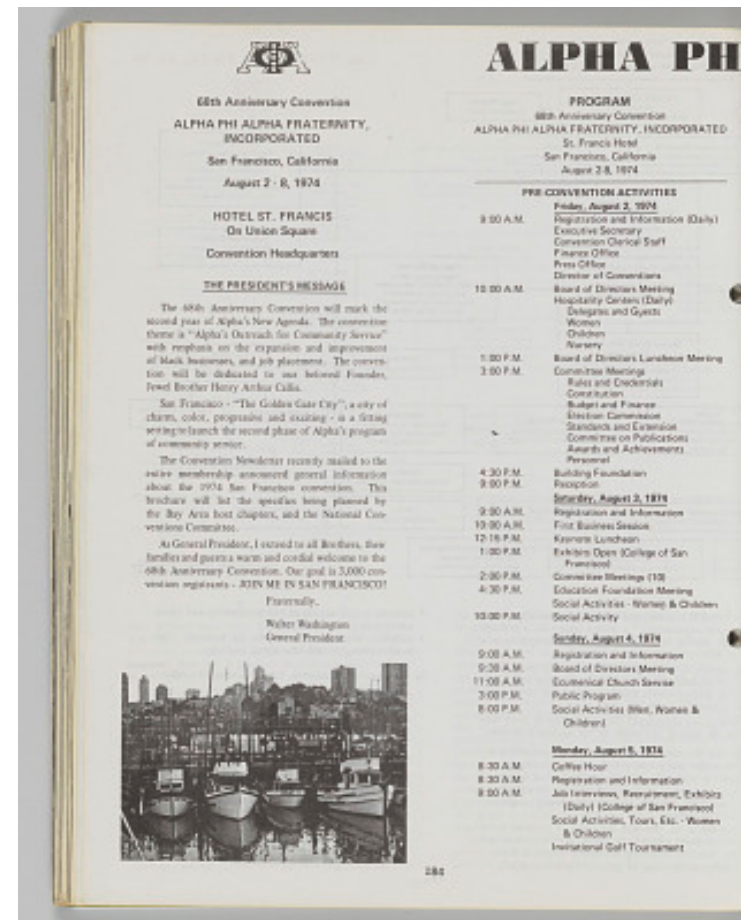
