

SHIRLEY ARCHIE SWORN IN AS NATIONAL PRESIDENT AT THE N.B.W. CONVENTION IN SEATTLE, WASHINGTON



Among the outstanding events taking place at the exciting and successful thirty-second convention of the N.B.W. in Seattle at the Westin Hostel, August 7-13, 1983, was the swearing-in of Mrs. Shirley Archie of Philadelphia as the new President, and her presentation to Dr. Cleota Wilbekin, immediate past President at the N.B.A. Awards Banquet on Friday night, August 12, a bronze plaque engraved with pictures which appeared in the May issue of the New York Times.

Mrs. Josephine Stokes and the Seattle Barristers' Wives are due many laundations for their hospitality. 81 wives were registered. Space does not permit description of all the well planned activities. Each was different and stimulating. The Youth Achievers Breakfast was much in keeping with our theme. Each of the young artists who performed had promise, and was presented with a medal from N.B.W.

Mrs. Juanita Hill of New York reported that the Marion Gaines Hill Fund is to be closed out and the remaining amount of \$800 is to be deposited in the Dorothy Atkinson Legal Scholarship Fund. The Dorothy Atkinson Legal Education Scholarship Committee held two meetings during the 1983 Convention. Mrs. Wilma Lassiter, Winston Salem, North Carolina in the absence of Dr. L. Gragg, acted at Chairperson. The committee composed of Jacqueline Holt, Washington, D.C.; Gwendolyn Howard, Baltimore, Maryland; Gertrude Jacke, Los Angeles; Marvinell Johnson, Fort Worth; And Marian Jones, New York. Based on the Decision Analysis Worksheet, William Leonard Chapman of New York; Tamara Rogers, Chicago; and Diane R. Williams, Philadelphia were the three winners. Each received a check for \$1270. The committee also
