

- 3° The mode of payment
- June 2nd 1921 Our letter in answer to Mr. CLARK's of June 1st
- June 7th 1921 Mr. CLARK's letter in answer to ours of June 2nd, accepting its terms
- June 10th 1921 Our invoice
 May 31st 1922 Mr. CLARK's letter telling us that he wants to send us a cheque of Frs 150.000
- June 16th 1922 Mr. CLARK's letter sending us cheque of Frs 150.000 June 29th 1922 Our letter acknowledging receipt of the cheque
- Dec. 14th 1922 Our letter giving his account
