
Dear Dick:

I found upon investigation that I had made a mistake about the time Dave Driskill had flown the Autogiro. The following is copied from his reports and includes his trip from Fort Knox to Manteo, No. Carolina:

Dave had a total of 4 hours and 55 minutes of instruction from Lt. Wm. A. Daniels, and then flew solo. And up to July 24, 41, he had atotal of 157 hours and one minute.
