AGREEMENT RESPECTING CONTINUATION OF THE ROCK CREEK AND THE POTOMAC PARKWAY AS A PARK ROAD THROUGH THE NATIONAL ZOOLOGICAL PARK

There had been considerable discussion of this item at the time the Report of the Executive Committee was under consideration. In view of the fact that the plan would not destroy any existing buildings, would make it easier to control through traffic, and that it appeared that it would be advantageous to the National Zoological Park in other ways, there was no further discussion. The Secretary stated that it is understood that District of Columbia money would be used for the cost of construction of the road.

On motion by Senator Saltonstall, seconded by Senator Fulbright, and carried it was

VOTED that the Board of Regents concure in the following agreement:

1. The Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution and the Secretary of the Interior, with the approval of the National Capital Planning Commission (45 stat. 162), agree to the continuation of the Rock Creek and Potomac Parkway as a park road through the National Zoological Park, thereby completing the connecting road between Rock Creek and Potomac Park.

2. The extension will follow the line plotted on the attachedd map as prepared by the Federal Bureau of Public Roads and recommended by representatives of the National Park Service, the Smithsonian Institution and the National Capital Planning Commission.

3. The extension will consist of two lanes only, crossing from west to east over Rock Creek just beyong Calvert Street Bridge, tunneling through Administration Hill (so-called) and following the east side of Rock Creek to Porter Street.

4. The Harvard Street entrance to the National Zoological Park will bridge over the parkway extension.

The extension will be fenced on the side adjacent to Rock Creek to protect the National Zoological Park against intruders from the parkway.

VOTED that the Board of Regents concurs in the following agreement:

 The Board of Repeats of the Builthoutan Institutions and the Secentary of the Instricts, with the approval of the National Capital Flowing Commission (17 Stat. 162), agree to the continuation of the Seck Creek and Potomer Persivary as a park read through the National Scolingical Park, thereby completing the connecting road between Bock Creek Park and Potomace Park.

 The extension will follow the line plotted on the attached map as propared by the Federal Duran of Public Roads and recommended by representatives of the National Park Service, the Smithsonian Institution and the National Capital Planning Commission.

 The extension will consist of two lance only, crossing from wart to east over Rock Crock just beyond Calvert Street Bridge, tusneling through Administration Hill (so-called) and following the east wide of Rock Creek to Poster Street.

 The Harvard Street entrance to the National Zoological Park will bridge over the parkway extension.

The extension will be feared on the side adjacent to Rock Creek to protect the National Scolegical Park against intruders from the parkway.

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
