My great grandmother she and two or three other women went where their children had been taken from them. Went up into this county and they were gone for three weeks or more walking through that country to where they got to where the children was and brought her two children back. All together, she had about 12 or 13 head of children from these three different husbands.

C.W. But your mother was the only child of her mother?

M.E. No, now my mother was the only child her mother had, that was my grandmother.

C.W. Right, right and so then you dropped out of school in the 6th grade?

M.E. That's right.

C.W. Why did you drop out of school?

M.E. Well my mother moved from Wilmington on Wrightsville down on the Sound. Then after she got married, some-
