He is active in a wide variety of other activities, including the boards of the Buffalo Bill Historical Center, the Grand Teton Music Festival, and Fort Phil Kearny, Bozeman Trail Association. He is also a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and a member of the American Legion.

Stanley O. Ikenberry, Chicago, Illinois. Dr. Ikenberry is President of the University of Illinois.
