In cooperation with AID. Smithsonian scientists cooperating in a study on the environmental effects of development, with specific focus on exploitation of oil resources in lesser developed countries.

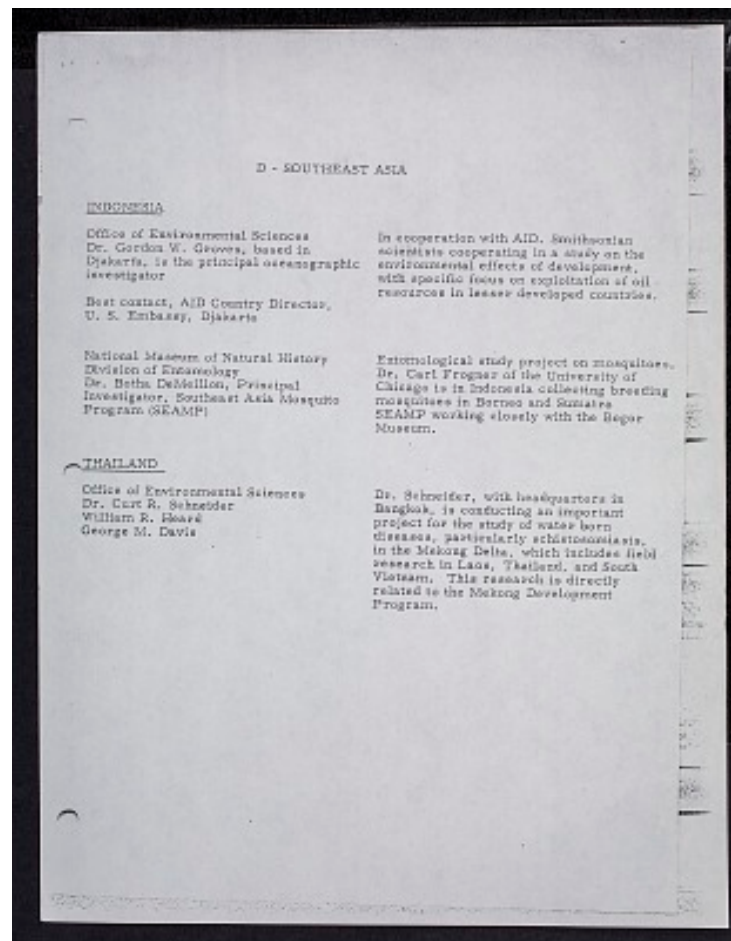
