
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Does we need warm outer as well as under clothing? I have a khaki suit which i have used in Mexico and it is splendid for the dust or not attracting a hot sun: for bedding I expect a good double blanket with a rubber poncho and a Navajo are sufficient. Around Tarupiso the flees and ticks were so bad it was impossible to sleep on the ground, so we had a folding cot like this on A&Fitch catalog Page 33 but not so heavy. If flees are bad they keep one of the ground and also on all ways has their bed with
