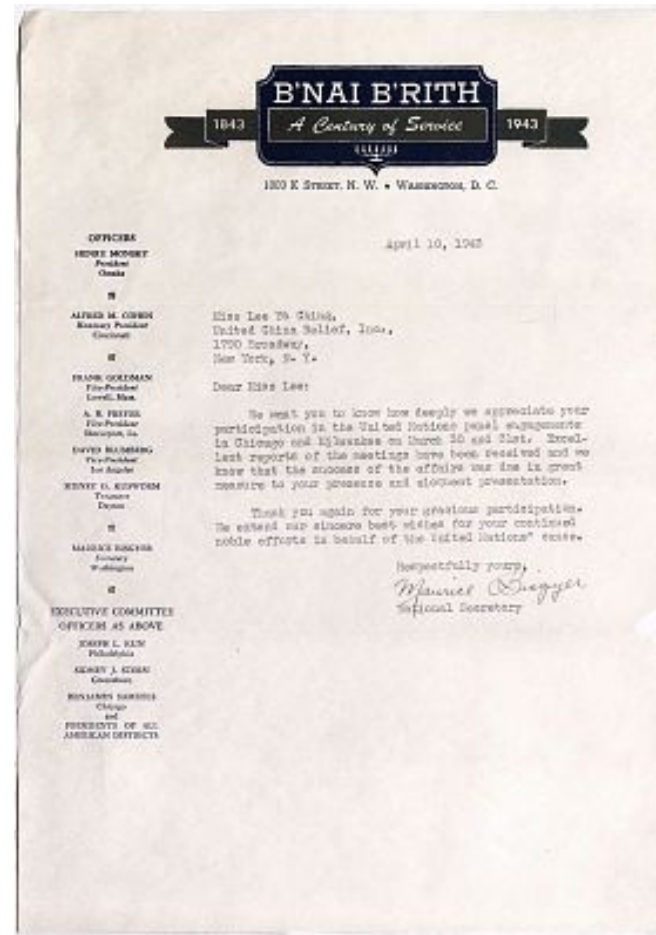
Dear Miss Lee:
