proper investigation be had in her case

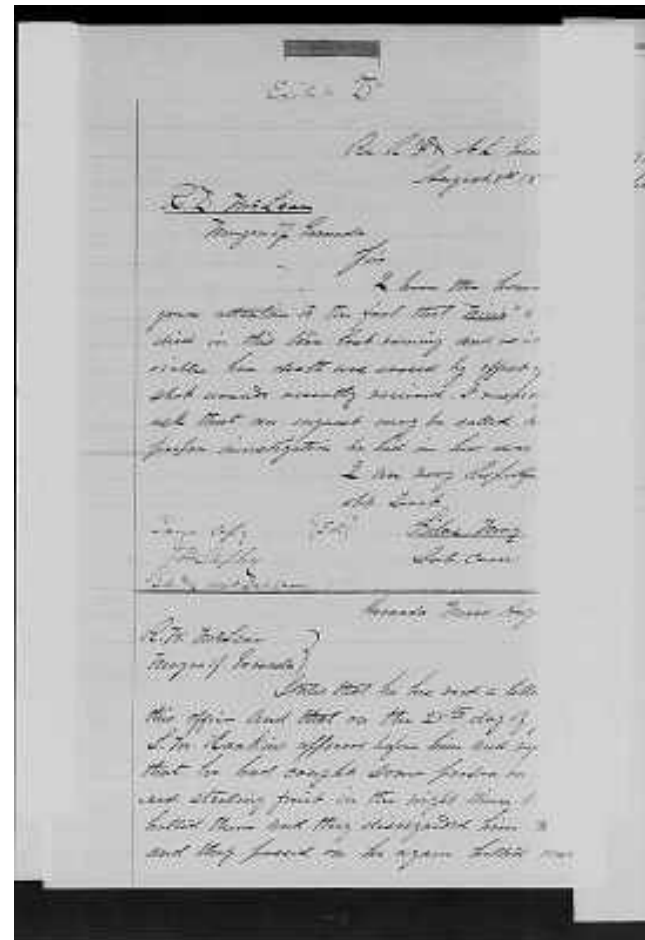
