Dear Dr. Pepper:

I have just received your letter dated June 17, 1916, asking for the name of the feather head-dress or "war-bonnet" of the Sioux Indians.

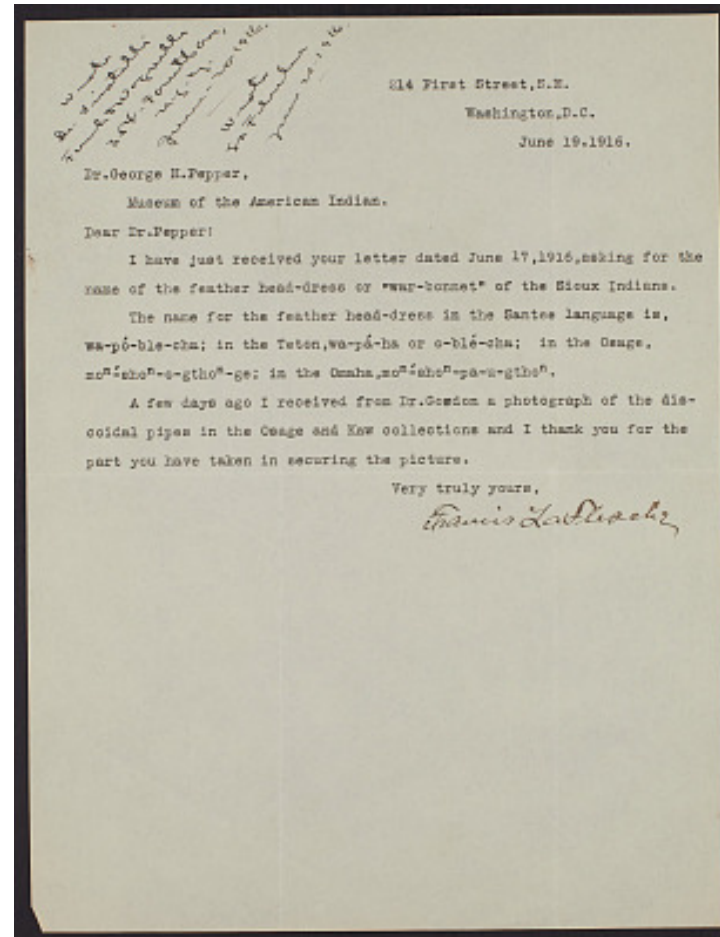
The name for the feather head-dress in the Santee language is, wa-pó-ble-cha; in the Teton, wa-pá-ha or o-blé-cha; in the Osage, moⁿ-shoⁿ-o-gthoⁿ-ge; in the Omaha, moⁿ-shoⁿ-pa-u-gthoⁿ.

A few days ago I received from Dr. Gordon a photograph of the discoidal pipes in the Osage and Kaw collections and I thank you for the part you have taken in securing the picture.
