

Spizella monticala is common along the sloughs in the bushes. The entire day was [[strikethrough]] a [[/strikethrough]] miserable showery and cold. The ice is getting very unsafe on the sloughs and is now full of holes and weak places.

13th

The rain stopped in the morning and a few geese and ducks Fuligula marila were seen and also a few [[?]].

About 11 a.m. I started up the [[?]] to the same place as yesterday and found that the geese were becoming quite numerous much more
