There is Fifty seven Acres of Land beautifully situated on a small running Creek. Two School Rooms one of them about 30 Ft Wide & 60 long with open Hall above the other is over 80 Ft long & about 25 Ft in Width. With Library under same roof. There is also three very good buildings belonging to the Institution used as Boarding Houses together with one or two small Offices Gardens &c., all Fraimid Buildings, The Collection of Books is very good. The operatus is not Compleet. The Buildings are all in good repair. The titles are good. The Country is healthy. The sight is a very disireable one for a School. The Property can be bought for \$800.00 Currency.
