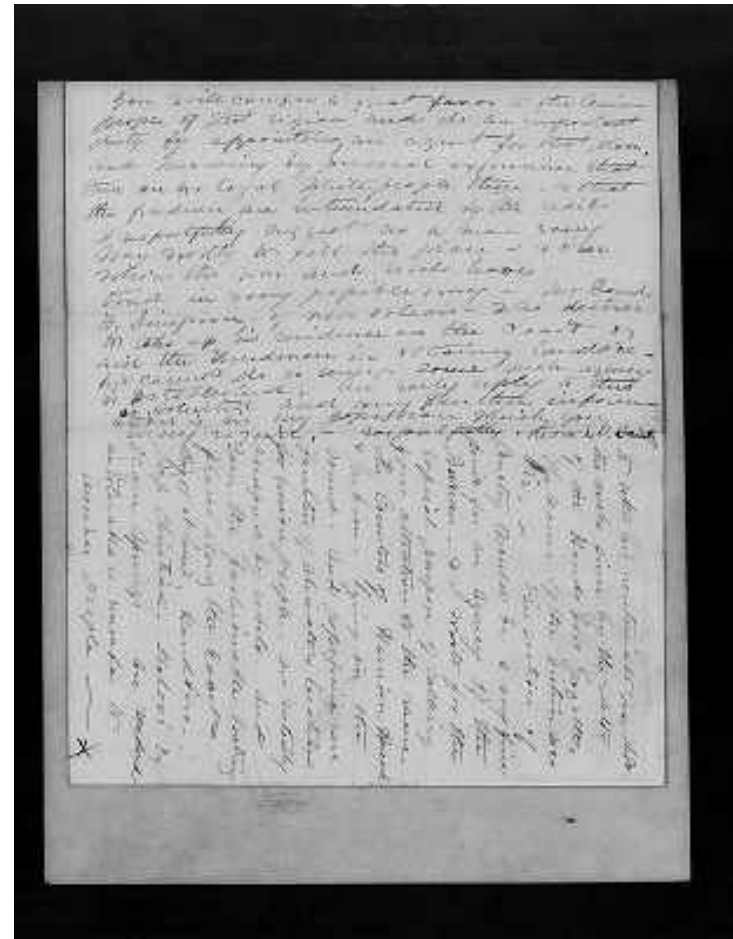

Simpson. of New Orleans- who desires to take up his residence on the Coast or aid the Freedmen in obtaining lands &c - but cannot do so unless some such agency is established. An early reply to this is solicited and further information is in my possession which you may require.- respectfully,
