I have the honor to state that this, my semi-monthly Report of the Condition of Freedmen & Operations of the Freedmen's Bureau presents little of interest. No Contracts have been made No change in rate of Wages.

The Freedmen are generally busy gathering the Cotton Crop. Fewer vagrants are seen, as Planters pay from .50¢ to 75¢ per 100 lbs Cotton picked, which is a powerful inducement for all to work

Considerable inquiry is made for the "Bureau Form of Labor Contracts.


