No change in rate of Wages.

The Freedmen are generally busy gathering the Cotton Crop. Fewer
vagrants are seen, as Planters pay from .50¢ to 75¢ per 100 lbs Cotton
picked, which is a powerful inducement for all to work

Considerable inquiry is made for the "Bureau Form of Labor Contracts.

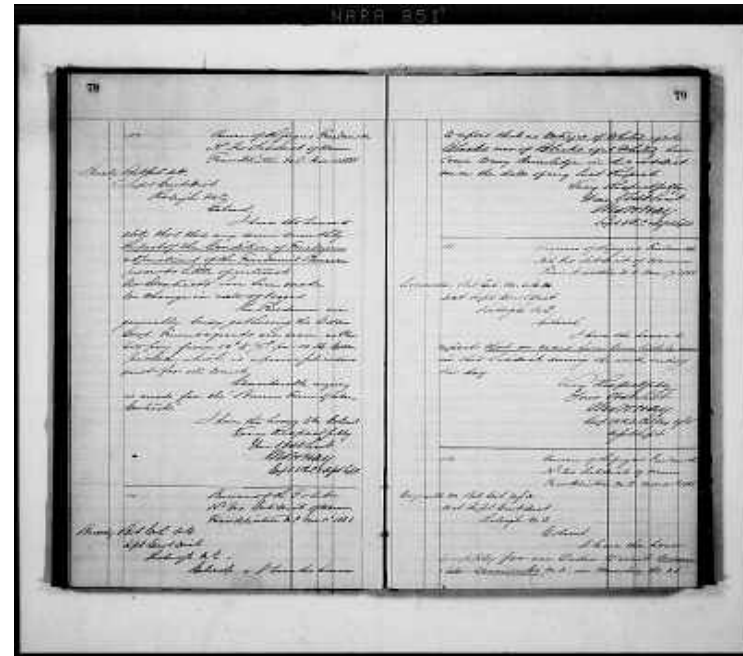
