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

Mr Wooten teacher of the colored school here, has called upon me in reference to a letter regarding a voucher amounting to two hundred dollars for materials furnished for repairing the school house in this place. In justice to Mr Wooten, I would state that he called upon me, and showed me the voucher before sending it to Major Watson, stating at the time that it was impossible for him to procure any material, or have any work performed without funds. I was fully aware of this fact, as the people about here are unacquainted with the value of vouchers and will only talk money, nor would they credit Mr Wooten on his own account. I advised Mr Wooten to make out and send on a requisition for materials and labor. This he did and received in return the above



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
